

This week we held conferences, despite the challenging weather conditions, and we extend our gratitude to the parents who made the effort to attend. These conferences provide valuable insights into your child's learning progress. A special thanks goes to our dedicated teachers who went above and beyond, spending extra time to meet with parents, as well as the hours that go into writing your child's Mid-Year Report.

We are currently experiencing a rise in winter 'flu cases affecting students and parents alike. Please remember to inform us if your child is unwell, as we will reach out if a student is absent from school. This communication helps us ensure the safety and accountability of all students. Each child's year-to-date attendance percentage was shared on the report sent home last week, with a goal of maintaining attendance above 90%, in line with the Ministry of Education's National Goal. Starting in 2026, the Board will need to implement a clear attendance plan, requiring specific actions from the school, based on various attendance levels. Families with children who have low attendance rates (except for health reasons) of 80% or lower will be affected by this plan. Those whose children have an attendance higher than 90% will be left untouched.



On a positive note, our playground is bustling with activity as students engage in games such as tag, ball tag, football, touch, tennis, basketball, and gaga ball. It's wonderful to see the children staying active. Additionally, many students are utilising the library during lunchtime for quiet reading or playing games. It seems that our focus on the Zones of Regulation is yielding positive results, especially in our playground.

I have had great feedback regarding the Mud Run last Friday. I know our students really enjoyed the day and had many stories to tell. A special thanks to those parents who helped prepare for the day and then supported children.

Parent Election Notice

Nominations are open for the election of **three** parent representatives to the Ararimu School Board.

All eligible voters will receive a nomination form. Use this form to nominate yourself or someone in your community. You will also receive a nomination cover letter calling for nominations. Information on who is not eligible to be a board member is provided with this notice, and the nomination form.

If you need more nomination forms, please contact the School Office.

Nominations close at noon on Wednesday 6th August 2025. You may provide a signed candidate statement and photograph with your nomination.

The electoral roll is held at the school and can be viewed during normal school hours.

As nominations are received, there will be a list of candidates' names kept at the school up until election day, which you can view.

Voting closes at 4pm on Wednesday 10th September 2025.

IF YOU REQUIRE FURTHER DETAILS ABOUT THE ELECTION

People who are not eligible to be school board members

The following people are not eligible to be school board members.

A person who:

- · is an undischarged bankrupt; or
- is prohibited from being a director or promoter of, or being concerned or taking part in the management of, an incorporated or unincorporated body under the <u>Companies Act 1993</u>, or the <u>Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013</u>, or the <u>Takeovers Act 1993</u>; or
- is a permanently appointed member of the Board staff, unless they are standing for election as a staff representative; or
- contracts or sub-contracts with the Board without the approval of the Secretary of Education and receives payments exceeding \$25,000 in any financial year. This would also cover situations where a person has a 10% or more shareholding in the contracting company or a company that controls the contracting company; or
- is subject to a property order under the <u>Protection of Personal and Property Rights Act</u> 1988; or
- has been convicted of a specified offence identified in <u>Schedule 2</u> of the Children's Act 2014, unless that person has obtained a pardon or been granted an exemption; or
- is a person in respect of whom a personal order has been made under that Act that either
 the person is not competent to manage his or her own property affairs, or does not have
 the capacity to communicate/make decisions relating to his/her welfare/personal care; or
- is a person who has been convicted of an offence punishable by imprisonment for 2 years
 or more, or who has been sentenced to imprisonment for any other offence, unless that
 person has obtained a pardon, served the sentence, or otherwise suffered the penalty
 imposed on the person; or
- is not a New Zealand citizen, and is
 - a person to whom section 15 or 16 of the Immigration Act 2009 applies; or
 - a person obliged, by or pursuant to that Act, to leave New Zealand immediately or within a specified time, being a time that was less than 12 months; or
 - > deemed for the purposes of that Act to be in New Zealand unlawfully.

A returning officer for an election (or by elections) of board members is not eligible to be nominated as a candidate in that election.


