Due to the short week for students we are sending this week's newsletter home one day early.

As you will be aware our school will be **closed tomorrow**, Thursday 23rd October, to all students due to the super strike by school staff, including:

On Friday 24th October school is also **closed** for our Ministry of Education approved Teacher Only Curriculum Day where we will be engaging with our primary school colleagues in learning about the refreshed mathematics curriculum. Thank you to Ms Cheryl Murphy who has been coaching the teams this year, and to our two parents, Rico Ellingford and Angela Parry, who accompanied the teams to Taupo.

As you will be aware, we are delivering 'Navigating the Journey' (sexuality) programme currently and encourage you to follow up with your child each night about what they learnt, and discussed, that day; your child's teacher should have sent you an overview of each of the lessons. We genuinely believe that best outcomes are achieved when parents are involved in the learning journey.

<u>Merit Programme:</u> The merit programme is designed to empower students to get involved in the myriad of opportunities in: academics, sports, cultural opportunities and civics roles and to become EMPOWERED students.



At this time of the year we see an upswing of students having merit points signed off, particularly after Term 4 assessments where progress and achievement is timely.
