Kia ora e te whānau, nau mai haere mai ki te pānui Wiki Rima - welcome to Term 4, Week 5.

We trust you've been enjoying the 'summer-like' days this week; a lovely change from last weeks' bitterly cold wind!

For the past two weeks we have been busy with completing 'Navigating the Journey' (Health programme), Term 4 academic assessments in Reading, Writing and Maths and Athletics sports. The assessment data is used to determine progress and achievement, is used for end of year reports to parents (these will come home on Thursday 11th December) and reporting to the Ministry of Education (Te Mahau) in relation to our school targets. The data is also shared with the college to support classroom placements. Most students have worked diligently on the assessments and can be proud of their efforts .... there is a flurry of applications for Honours after merit points have been earned.

Honours: if your child is working towards achieving Honours, I encourage you to visit the 'applying for Honours' information on our school website through this <u>link</u>. There are two parts to Honours; earning the merit points and demonstrating our school values consistently throughout the year. They must apply for Honours; it is not an entitlement. Best wishes to all those students who have been striving for Honours - it is great to see the dispositions of EMPOWERED shining!

Uniform: Thank you for your support to ensure your child is wearing the correct uniform; in Term 4 this means:

- Black roman sandals OR plain black shoes and plain black socks (we encourage sandals due to the warmer weather)
- No tracksuit pants (these are for only Terms 2/3)

Most students are wearing our uniform with pride; remember full formal uniform must be worn to / from school apart from Friday afternoons (PE uniform can be worn home after sports).

As you will be aware, teachers are in the middle of negotiations with the union in support of improving conditions (it is certainly not just about remuneration) for both teachers and learners. Teachers are raising concerns about heavy workloads, severe staffing shortages, and increasing demands such as extra pastoral care and rapid curriculum change.

The negotiations are not just about immediate salary, but about ensuring the teaching profession remains sustainable, supported and able to give students the quality education they deserve. We thank you for your support.

Last week it was 'Teacher Appreciation Day' which we celebrated on Friday. At MIS I can genuinely say we are extremely lucky to have such hardworking and committed teachers who go 'above and beyond' to provide a myriad of opportunities for your child/ren.

#### **Inter-Intermediate Softball:**

On Tuesday, the MIS II Softball Girls and Boys teams participated in the Inter-Intermediate competition hosted by Peachgrove Intermediate at Resthills Park, Hamilton.

Both teams were placed in a pool of four, with games lasting 45 minutes in a round-robin format. The top team from each pool advanced directly to the finals. The Boys team lost their first game but bounced back to win the next two, finishing second in their pool and third overall.

## 2025 Health and Wellbeing Survey Summary:

Both parents and students from the 2025 surveys recognise the same top three topics as important: Navigating the Journey, Mental Health, Smoking, Vaping, Drugs and Alcohol Education. This survey showed the parents were supportive of our Morrinsville Intermediate School Health and Well-being programmes and initiatives.

Parents and students' top feedback emphasised accessible wellbeing support for our students (e.g. mailbox system), student input opportunities for Health topics, staff PD, inclusion of neurodiversity, and a potential Wellbeing/Hauora Hub being developed. Life Education has been rebooked for 2026 to address health education priorities.
