CALF AND LAMB DAY 2024

Friday 17th October

ANIMALS

We will be welcoming lambs, calves, goats and chickens for our animal section. Important details are as follows:

Birth Dates:

Lambs: Early: 01 July - 18 August Late: 19 August onwards

Calves: Early: 24 June - 31 July Late: 01 to 31 August (September calves are ok)

Goats: After 01 July

Please also note the following criteria relating to the above animals:

- Students shall start caring for their animals within one week of its birth and thereafter, as far as is reasonably possible, personally care for the animal throughout the competition.
- Students shall use any kind of food in any amount and understand that the animal shall not be raised on its mother or a foster mother.

If you already have your animal (calf, lamb, goat or chicken), please complete the Animal Registration Form which can be found in the school office.

HORTICULTURE

The horticulture section of our Calf and Lamb Day is always such a vibrant environment once all the students have brought their plants to school for judging. It is the expectation that if your child does not have an animal, they enter at least one plant in this section (they can enter both animal and horticulture sections). As always, the horticulture section will be divided into two groups, Years 1 - 4 and Years 5 - 8.

The Horticulture Section will include the following categories;

Strawberries in a planter - plant when ready (seedlings will be in stores soon)

Herbs in a planter - plant when ready, in store from now (keep them pruned)

Spuds in a bucket - plant around 20 August.

Plant in the bottom of a bucket. Add a thin layer of topsoil as the leaves sprout. Do this 6 - 7 times until the bucket is full.

Water frequently but keep well drained.

Tomato in a bucket - plant around 20 August. Keep laterals pinched.

Lettuce in a planter - plant around 10 September

Flowers in a planter - see garden centres for advice on when to plant your selection so that it blooms just before Calf & Lamb Day













Remember to take into consideration the timing of when the seedlings are planted - they need to be at their very best on Calf and Lamb Day.



PLANTING DAY SUMMARY:

17 June 2025

Sunshine and sunny smiles were the order of the day at this year's Trees for Survival planting day!

Students returned to a site the school had planted 2 years prior. The Koheroa site is flat with wet clay soil and surrounds a picturesque lake. During our briefing we discussed the species of plants we were planting and their benefits to the environment. The students proved very knowledgeable and enthusiastic about the positive impact their planting would have.

The site had been expertly prepared by owners Tony, AJ, Clementine, and a host of friends and family.

Although the site was still wet and boggy after torrential rain in the week prior, students listened carefully to instructions and negotiated the mud without incident to complete their planting in just 1.5 hours!

With 764 Cyperus, kanuka, manuka, cabbage tree and flax in the ground the students took time out to view the school's 2023 planting. It was great to see the plants thriving and the ground firming up with the native plants absorbing the excess water.

For their efforts students enjoyed a bbq lunch courtesy of Clementine and Phil. Well done Mangatangi! Your plants will increase soil stability, filter run off and increase biodiversity! What a fabulous way to spend a sunny day!


Auckland Council intends to undertake an aerial application of 1080 (Sodium fluoroacetate) in the Hūnua Ranges this winter. This notification is required as part of the Ministry of Health requirements for the operation.

The operation area includes Hūnua Ranges regional park, including Waharau and Whakatiwai regional parks and the Department of Conservation (DOC) administered Mataitai Conservation Area, Mataitai Scenic Reserve, Papa Turoa Scenic Reserve, Whakatiri Scenic Reserve, Plows Road Conservation Area, Paparimu Conservation Area and Mataitai Forest Conservation Area Mangatawhiri Forest Conservation Area, Vining Scenic Reserve and Richard Sylvan Memorial Reserves as well as some adjoining private land.

The application of both toxic and non-toxic bait remains weather dependant, with operations planned for between late July and October 2025.
