FURTHER CALF & LAMB DAY INFORMATION for 20 OCTOBER 2023

Students with Animals: All students with animals will need to be at school in school uniform no later than 9:30am ready for the judging to start at 10:00am. Animals need to be tied to the fence along the school boundary. All students with animals need to go to Mrs Rowberry in the school office to get their number for the day. This number will need to be returned at the end of the judging, and at this time students need to let Mrs Rowberry know if they are attending Group Day. This year Group Day will be hosted by Onewhero School on Thursday 2nd November.

Students without Animals: Students who do not have an animal will need to be at school in school uniform by the normal time and buses will run as usual. The bus will likely leave at 2:00pm in the afternoon, so please ensure that you have made arrangements for your children to be met at this earlier time. There will only be one afternoon bus run on the day. You need to meet on the court at 9.00am, including those with their parents, so we can confirm who is here. If your sibling has an animal you may come to school with them by 9.30am as long as you check in to the office to say that you are at school. Students without animals will be expected to watch the animal judging. They will not be able to play in the sandpit or the playground. Some senior students will be asked to help.

Animal Presentation: Does your animal have clean ears, eyes, nose, hooves, teeth and wash any grubby spots. Remember, lambs are not to be brushed (excluding their legs)

Horticulture Section: Your plants and Plant Diaries need to be at school by 9.00am on Thursday 19th Oct

Uniform: All students will need to wear their school uniform on the day. This includes their school hat (these will be left outside the classrooms on Friday morning). Students will also need to wear the correct school uniform if they choose to attend Group Day.

Pre-Schoolers and High School Students (and students from other schools): This is a family day and we encourage you all to attend. The playground and sand pit areas are always available to for any pre-schoolers to use. It is important that all pre-school and school-aged students are supervised. High School students are more than welcome on the day as long as they have a parent or caregiver with them. This is a school day, so they are at Calf & Lamb Day for the purpose of watching and being involved with the day.

Indoor Exhibits: This wonderful aspect of our day is always popular. A reminder that all our classrooms are locked first thing in the morning and this year will be opened when the animal judging concludes, around 11:00am - 12.30pm prior to the auctions. All Indoor Exhibits have been completed at school with the exception of the Technology section which is Recycled Steampunk Animals. Classrooms will be open at the end of the day for your child to collect some of their indoor exhibits. Please check with the classroom teacher which items are able to be taken.

Raffles: The Year 7/8 students without animals and parents will be out and about selling tickets for our raffles on the day.

Eftpos: Is available between at the Cake Stall/Café and BBQ Food tents

Staffroom: The staffroom is reserved for the Stewards and Judges to meet, and have their morning tea/lunch. We ask that unless you are required to be in the staff room you refrain from going in there.

Book Fair: The Scholastic Book Fair will be on display in the library. There are always bargains to be had, so make sure you take a look. Eftpos is available
