### STREP THROAT

We have been notified that there has been a confirmed case of the highly contagious bacterial infection Strep Throat at school.

Please make a note of the symptoms below, and take it seriously if your child says they have a sore throat. Keep them home and make it a priority to contact their doctor. A course of antibiotics will most likely be prescribed as Strep Throat can develop into serious heart and kidney complications if left untreated.

- Common symptoms are as follows:
- Difficult and painfull swallowing
- Headache
- Body aches
- Tiny red spots at the back of the throat, on the roof of the mouth
- Red and swollen tonsils
- Tonsils with white patches and streaks of pus
- Throat pain that begins quickly
- Swollen lymph nodes in the neck
