# MANGATANGI SCHOOL CROSS COUNTRY Friday 1st August, 11:00am

As you are aware, the students have been busy training for our Cross Country. Our Cross Country is on **next** Friday 1st August and all the information you need is below:

- All students are expected to arrive at school in full school uniform, then they will be given time to change into their spare cross country clothes.
- House colours or school sports shirts are appropriate if you have them:

Air - yellow, Earth - green, Fire - red, Water - blue.

- Please remember to pack an extra bag to put dirty clothes in after the event.
- Students will be changing back into their uniforms if they are going home on the bus.
- Students need to remember their water bottle for after the race.
- The race will again be held on the farm across the road, thanks to the McCallum Family and Mark & Stephanie Alderlieste.
- Depending on the age of child, they will be running through paddocks, puddles, swamps and up and down hills, and approximate distances are as follows:

Years 1 & 2	500m	Years 3 & 4	1000m
Year 5	1500m	Year 6 & Years 7 & 8 Girls	2000m
Year 7 Boys	2500m	Year 8 Boys	3000m

- The first race will start at 11:00am and the order is as follows:
- Year 8's, Year 7 boys, Year 6 boys, Year 5's and Year 6 & 7 girls, Year 4's, Year 3's, Year 2's, Year 0/1's
- We cannot give you exact start times, however, each race should take approximately 10 15 minutes, although we may be forced to overlap the races depending on the weather.
- We will not be walking the course, so your children will be need to listen to and follow the instructions given prior to their race. The courses are clearly marked, so they should be able to follow the markers. Volunteers will be marshals on the day.
- Parking is between the school and the Playcentre, please do not park along the edge of the road as it is already narrow!
- Adults and children will walk across the field to the bottom field gate where they will cross the road. It is a fair little hike down a hill, across a swamp, up part of "Killer Hill" and through the paddock to the start.
- No children can cross the road without an adult.
- Spectators are **not** permitted to bring pets.
- There are no toilets available on the farm.
- Gumboots and warm jackets are essential for spectators. The start/finish area is very exposed, so please ensure you and your children are well wrapped up (children MUST take their school polar fleeces over with them)!
- If you would like to take your child home after the cross country event please remember to sign them out with their teacher, who will have a class list on them.
- If extreme weather causes it to be unsafe for us to hold all races, you will be notified via our Hero App and Facebook page. As it is a winter sport we will be endeavouring to go ahead though.
- Please contact Mrs Rowberry in the office if you are able to help marshal on the day.
- For those who are invited, East Group Cross Country will be held on Tuesday 12th August (at the same place as our cross country).



# CALF & LAMB DAY 2025 PRELININARY INFORMATION

It is the time of the year when we start to see calves and lambs in the paddocks around the area. If your children are planning on having an animal for Calf & Lamb Day, please note the birth date criteria below:

**Lambs :** Early: 01 July - 18 August

Late: 19 August onwards

Calves: Early: 24 June - 31 July

Late: 01 to 31 August (September calves are ok)

Goats: After 01 July

Please also note the following criteria relating to the above animals:

- Students shall start caring for their animals within one week of its birth and thereafter, as far as is reasonably possible, personally care for the animal throughout the competition.
- Students shall use any kind of food in any amount and understand that the animal shall not be raised on its mother or a foster mother.

Animal registration forms will be made available from the school office from the start of Term 3.

#### **HORTICULTURE**

If children do not have an animal, Mangatangi School expectations are that they will participate in the Horticulture section of the day. Dates for planting will be detailed in the newsletters in Term 3. Students are welcome to enter both categories if they would like.

#### **TECHNOLOGY PROJECT**

This year's Technology project is a **Letterbox!** Technology is one of the four "indoor exhibits" categories, and this is the only one which is completed 100% at home (the other three are completed in class).

When the planning for your child's letterbox is underway, please ensure the following:

- It must be able to be kept outdoors
- It must be freestanding (though we do not need the stand for judging, just the box)
- It is to be no bigger than 500mm x 500mm

It will need to be brought to school during the week of 13 October (2nd week of Term 4).

Auckland Council intends to undertake an aerial application of 1080 (Sodium fluoroacetate) in the Hūnua Ranges this winter. This notification is required as part of the Ministry of Health requirements for the operation.


The operation area includes Hūnua Ranges regional park, including Waharau and Whakatiwai regional parks and the Department of Conservation (DOC) administered Mataitai Conservation Area, Mataitai Scenic Reserve, Papa Turoa Scenic Reserve, Whakatiri Scenic Reserve, Plows Road Conservation Area, Paparimu Conservation Area and Mataitai Forest Conservation Area Mangatawhiri Forest Conservation Area, Vining Scenic Reserve and Richard Sylvan Memorial Reserves as well as some adjoining private land.

The application of both toxic and non-toxic bait remains weather dependant, with operations planned for between late July and October 2025.


