- Please ensure all uniform items are named, especially polar fleeces.




CONTACTING YOUR CHILD'S TEACHER

ATTENDANCE & ABSENCE GUIDELINES

There are many things we need to report to the Ministry of Education, and attendance is one of them. Below is a list of the common codes used when marking an absence. It is so important you let us know when your child is away and why, otherwise it gets recorded as an unjustified absence. You are able to view your child's absence through the Hero app. If you do take a look, remember we record the roll twice per day (so 2 absences equals one day).
