MANAAKITANGA is our overarching core value for this term. Caring, respecting and hospitality are the 3 main attributes that we will be unpacking..

I must say that Manaakitanga was in its' truest form during Puanga as we hosted our Kaumatua Luncheon. Thank you to all the hands that made it possible.

We have four projects that have been floating around the school. They are as follows: TE TOMOKANGA KI TE AO MĀRAMA- Gateway to Understanding. A deliberate attempt for everyone to get to know each other. To get to understand the why, the what, the when, the which and the how through a Māori worldview lens. Can we we do this together? Yes, we can.

NGĀ HUA O TE WĀNANGA- The Fruits of Learning. A deliberate attempt to utilise our Maara as our Enviro Classroom. So many things happen in our Maara, and by fostering doable systems and careful maintenance we can upkeep a sustainable community whilst introducing our very own Enviro Literacy!

WHANAUNGATANGA KI TE TAIAO - Connecting with the Environment. Another deliberate attempt to make connections with our Environment. In particular, the land, the water, the air and fire. This connection has taken the skills of Ngā mahi a Rēhia, which is inclusive of the Arts. Sports, Drama, and Technology. Everything that sits in these strands are ways of connecting with the environment. The two main classrooms that are helping us to achieve these goals are the Maara and the Lake.






Please note: As TOD did not happen last term, our Staff will be holding our TOD on September Friday 19th.


Administration

FROM THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION

Attendance

One of the things we are continuing to focus on in 2025 is student attendance. You will hear us talking about this with you, with our students and it remains a strong subject of conversation in the staff room.

If a student misses one day of school every two weeks, they miss more than a whole year of school by 16 years of age. As a parent or caregiver, you, alongside our school, play a key role in building strong habits of regular school attendance.

All students are legally required to attend school every day and it is a shared responsibility to make sure students attend and engage in learning from when they first start school.

You must let the school know if your child is going to be absent or intends to be absent for a portion of the school term for whatever reason, like a tangi or medical procedure. Family holidays or taking time off for extracurricular activities (not organised by school) are not acceptable reasons for being absent.

Knowing if your child is well enough to go to school can be tricky. If you are still unsure, get in touch with us and let's work together to support your learner.

If you're struggling at home with getting your child to school, talk to us.

If you are finding it hard to get your child to school, please talk with us so we can work together. Our school is committed to supporting your child to attend school.

Our school continues to build a culture that fosters attendance every day by having:

- · School staff who have strong relationships with students and family.
- A school culture that recognises your child and your family for who you are, where you come from and what you value.
- A school whānau that takes all practical steps to make sure your child is at school and progressing in their learning.
- A school that is safe and welcoming for everyone in our school community.
