Looking Ahead – 2026



Next year we continue to have two classes, Kowhai and Kauri. Mrs Magda Jordan will be teaching Kowhai Class Years 1 to 4 and Mr Julian Dimond will be our principal release teacher for Mrs Tamae Dimond in the senior room, Kauri Class with Years 5 to 8. There will be additional teaching support and teacher aide support.

The Board of Trustees have approved funding to release Mrs Dimond full time for 2026. This would not only cover the management role for the principal's position but also Mrs Dimond will plan to provide additional support in the classroom promoting wellbeing for all, enhancing student learning, and professional learning opportunities for our teachers in the curriculum

refresh. This is a focus for the school's strategic plan. Finance will be used from reserves. Based on our provisional roll MOE calculations we are on track to maintain current staffing levels for 2026.

Prizegiving

Our annual prizegiving will be held on Thursday 11 December starting at 10.00am. Please ensure you are seated 10 minutes before in the multipurpose room.
