

Duntroon School Pool – Code of Conduct 2023/24

Safety

- Key holders are responsible for ALL people they admit to the pool.
- No one is to swim alone.
- Keys are for the use of family members and their guests.
- Children under the age of 16 must be actively supervised by a person 18 years or older.
- Due to health and hygiene reasons all babies/toddlers not yet toilet trained must wear swim pants such as Huggies "Little Swimmers" (not underwear) whilst swimming.
- No jumping, bombing or diving into the pool.

Pool

- Opening hours: 6am 9pm (During school terms the pool is closed to the public from 9am 3pm).
- It is essential that you sign the pool register when you enter the complex.
- Please ensure the cover is placed back over the pool and that the gate is locked when leaving.
- Please leave the complex in a tidy state and remove own rubbish.
- The swimming pool complex is smoke free at all times.





Here are a few photos of our activities.



The Danseys pass trail ride covers a wide range of country from the tussock hill blocks up towards the otekaieke reserve, forestry blocks behind livingstone, gnarly bush tracks behind the Maraewhenua river, and spectacular views from the top of ben lomond. It has track levels for everyone from a family friendly 50cc level trail, fast and open intermediate track, 2 advanced loops providing diverse riding conditions and an 'extreme' gnarly tight track. Very few people can complete all the tracks in a day, which keeps people coming back for the fun and the challenge.



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Providing epic tracks makes this a great ride,

We need <u>track makers</u> and people to help with <u>track maintenance</u> leading up to the day of the event

If you enjoy riding a 2 wheeler and want to be involved in the track team talk to Phil Wilson (0274240311) Track levels range from family to extreme.

If you're happy to use loppers, line trimmers, weed wackers or chainsaws, to clear broom gorse, and trees from tracks come along to some working bees. You will start to see notices in the newsletter/facebook pages/Skool Loop regarding track working bees. For any information about this you can talk to Lowri OCallaghan (0211176214)

Having a smoothly run event makes this ride a great event to come to.

People arrive at the 'Base paddock' from 7am. We need lots of people on deck here to get the event started. We require people to help with.

car parking, registration and payments, checking bikes and riders for safety gear

For any questions relating to these jobs, talk to Kirsty McLachlan (0274274344) in the first instance.

Providing a safely run event is also what makes this a great ride. we need <u>track marshalls</u> to ride loops of the tracks throughout the day, Riders also cross roads out on track, and we need help <u>manning the road crossings</u>

If riding bikes is up your alley, and you're happy to help in this way let Phil Wilson (0274240311) know. You need to be available to pre ride on Thursday and on the day.

If you're happy to sit out on a quiet country road for some part of the day, this can just be for a 2hr stint, or if you're available all day, you can cover a variety of crossings throughout the day. Many of the roads will see no car traffic, so bringing young kids will be fine. The busier roads are best suited for people who are able to find help for kids on the day, or have older children (over 10) for questions regarding this talk to Kirsty McLachlan (0274274344)

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Providing a great ride day also means FOOD! We provide food for riders and volunteers on the day with a <u>BBQ</u> running from 8am-5pm.

Kids can also help by selling spark arrestors at registration tent, they can hand out rider briefings as riders line up to register, and older kids can be the second adult on the quieter road crossings.
