Education Review Office

We had John, our evaluation partner from the Education Review Office come and visit school this week. The purpose of this visit was to work on summarising school conditions, learner outcomes and the overall strategic direction of Duntroon School. John has been working alongside Duntroon School for the last 2 years so knows our school well. He spent time speaking with myself, our Board of Trustees presiding member, Jason Sanford, staff, and students. He also visited classrooms to see some teaching happening. We were very pleased with the summary we received. We now have a draft report that will be available to parents sometime in term 4.

A couple of quotes from our draft report:

'student achievement in reading, writing and mathematics is increasingly excellent and equitable.'

'a school learning climate that is positive and underpinned by a school wide commitment to mana enhancing, respectful relationships.'

As soon as the full report is finalised, I will let parents know how to access it online.

Property Work

Over the next couple of months, we will have two property projects starting. We are getting the main entrance to school fixed. This will all be dug out, retained and new seal put in place. We are also getting a full bathroom put into the school where our existing accessibility toilet currently is. We will keep you posted on these projects. Downloading the Skool Loop app - a step by step guide

Once you have downloaded the Skool Loop App, via either your Google Play or App store, please follow the below instructions to select your school -


- Open the Skool Loop App you will land on a welcome page.
- Click the 'Select your schools' this will bring you to a menu you can either search your school
 or follow the country/region prompts.
- Once you reach your school, select it with the tick on the righthand side.
- · Tap the 'select schools' button in the top right corner.
- · Tap the big orange choose button. This will load your school and bring you to the settings page.
- Subscribe to the groups that are relevant to you, then click the 'go back' button on your phone, which will bring you to the main screen of your schools app.


