- A restorative approach leads to individuals taking responsibility for their behaviour.

Our key focus at school is developing positive relationships with our tamariki and whanau, ensuring that everyone feels safe, is engaged in learning and takes responsibility for their actions.


NGA KERERU

Here are some examples of the **wonderful haiku** we created!








BOOK WEEK
