Goal 1 Theme: Kotahitanga — Strengthening Community and Connection

Specific Goal: To strengthen authentic partnerships between school, whānau, parish, and community that reflect the diversity and faith of Holy Cross.

<u>Catholic Character Focus:</u> Deepen our connection with Holy Trinity Parish and the wider Archdiocese through shared celebration, prayer, and service opportunities

Goal 2 Theme: Ako — Deep, Connected Learning for Every Child

<u>Specific Goal:</u> To ensure every learner experiences success through a rich, connected curriculum that reflects who they are and where they come from.



The beginning of November brings two important observances in the Catholic tradition: All Saints' Day (1st Nov) and All Souls' Day (2nd Nov). These days offer a chance for our school community to reflect on faith, remembrance, and the communion of saints. The students will be remembering loved ones who passed away and name our favourite saints next Friday at our usual Friday morning whole school prayers in the hall at 9 am. You are always welcome to attend.

All Saints' Day is a Holy Day of Obligation that celebrates all Christian saints.

This day honors the heavenly saints for their virtuous faith, inspiring us to pursue holiness through lives dedicated to God and service.

Room 11





We have loved swimming every Thursday and are so excited to have Kingsley and Lucah join us for the rest of the year!










Room 12

Since we have been learning about adverbs in writing, we wrote about Diwali:


Action (verb) + adverb light diyas + carefully colour rangoli + mindfully Sita walked through the forest + fearfully Rama fought the demons + bravely

Guidance following increased national risk of measles

Health New Zealand is alerting schools to an escalating risk of measles as it responds to a measles outbreak following confirmation of 13 new cases of measles since 20 October.

This escalating risk is a concern, especially for education settings where measles can spread rapidly. In New Zealand, our measles immunisation rates are too low to prevent outbreaks from happening when measles is circulating in our communities. Our low immunisation rates contribute to this lack of community protection.

Measles is highly contagious and serious – about one in three people may need hospital care. It spreads when an infected person breathes, coughs or sneezes.

Information to share with parents, caregivers and your communities

- Measles is circulating and is very contagious. There is now measles in Northland, Auckland, Manawatu, Nelson and Wellington, and we expect further cases across New Zealand.
- Watch out for symptoms fever, cough, runny nose, sore eyes, and a blotchy rash:

- Anyone with measles symptoms must stay at home and should seek urgent advice by ringing their doctor or Healthline on 0800 611 116.
- Anyone who is closely exposed to a measles case must stay at home. Heath New Zealand will provide individuals with
 advice on a case-by-case basis (including when they can leave quarantine at home).
- Health New Zealand is actively working with the schools that currently have measles cases.
- People are considered immune to measles after having two doses of a measles vaccine from 12 months or older, or if
 you have had measles before. For more information on measles immunity visit:

Anyone born between 1969 and 2004 may have only received one vaccine dose and might not be fully protected. It's





Once you have downloaded the Skool Loop App, via either your Google Play or App store, please follow the below instructions to select your school

- Open the Skool Loop App you will land on a welcome page.
- 2. Click the 'Select your schools' this will bring you to a menu you can either search your school or follow the country/region prompts.
- 3. Once you reach your school, select it with the tick on the righthand side. You can select as many schools as required.
- 4. Tap the 'select schools' button in the top right corner.
- 5. Tap the big orange choose button. This will load your school and bring you to the settings page.
- Subscribe to the groups that are relevant to you, then click the 'go back' button on your phone, which will bring you to the main screen of your schools app.
