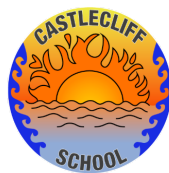

ATTENDANCE

We have 42 ākonga who have improved their attendance with 21 of those moving into the good attendance zone. Overall, we have 112 ākonga attending school with good attendance (a slight improvement on 101 in Term 1) with 46 of those ākonga sitting on 100% attendance so far for Term 2 - ka mau te wehi e te whānau! Great stuff.

We have noticed that there are a number of ākonga being picked up early from school on a regular basis, some as early as 2.00pm (immediately following second break). Missing the last block of school every day is equal to missing 18 half days of learning school over a term. Even leaving school early at 2.30pm each day equates to just over 6 half days of missed learning. Every minute at school is precious whānau, so if it's not for a valid reason, please avoid collecting tamariki early.
