- ⇒ Please wrap school lunches in tinfoil if they are to be heated

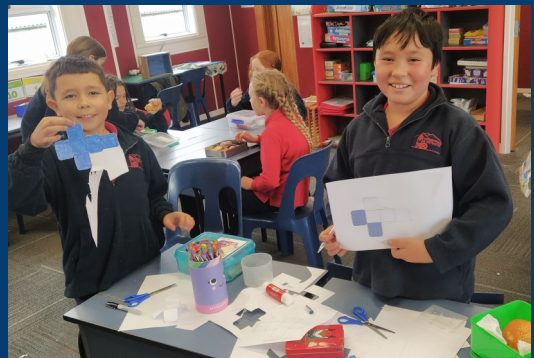
Kahikatea Happenings....
