We have had a fabulous start to Term Three. Our students are settled, working well and showing our school values.

Dorreen is helping us with the new regulations around **Literacy and Numeracy** and how, as teachers, we can plan and implement our programmes. These are exciting times in education and we are all spending time consolidating our Structured Literacy knowledge as we move into the Structured Maths.

The annual **Tararua Seven's tournament** is on the 30th of July. You would have had a notice home if your child is involved in this. All year 6/7/8's play in this tournament and we make up the teams with some younger players. **Please** ensure the permission notice is sent back to school.

Whanau meetings were postponed last term due to sickness. Thank you for understanding this. We will be holding them next Monday. Time slots stay the same. Whanau meetings are an opportunity to catch up with your child's teacher, talk about their school report and make plans for the rest of the year. It is also a great space for any concerns you may have, to be brought up.

What do boards do?

The board has overall responsibility and accountability for the school/kura. School board's legal responsibilities are determined by the Education and Training Act 2020.

The Act sets out boards' four primary objectives. These are ensuring student achievement for all of its students, including for those of differing needs, making sure the school is a safe place for all, and giving effect to the Treaty of Waitangi.

As part of its focus on these four objectives, boards' responsibilities include:

- · Setting the strategic direction for the school
- · Protecting the school's values
- Monitoring and evaluating student learning outcomes
- Approving policies
- Financial stewardship
- Building community engagement and support

It's important to note that the board does **NOT** get involved in the day-to-day running of the school.

What help do board members get?

NZSTA provides free advice and support to all boards to help them do the very best for their students and community.

We have a dedicated team of advisors who help boards with governance and employment issues.

We also run a comprehensive programme of professional development workshops – most of which are free to attend. They will help you understand your role as a board member and you will gain valuable knowledge and skills.
