

One of the board's primary objectives is making sure every child reaches their highest possible standard in educational achievement.

What do boards do?

The board has overall responsibility and accountability for the school/kura. School board's legal responsibilities are determined by the Education and Training Act 2020.

The Act sets out boards' four primary objectives. These are ensuring student achievement for all of its students, including for those of differing needs, making sure the school is a safe place for all, and giving effect to the Treaty of Waitangi.

As part of its focus on these four objectives, boards' responsibilities include:

- Setting the strategic direction for the school
- · Protecting the school's values
- Monitoring and evaluating student learning outcomes
- Approving policies
- Financial stewardship
- Building community engagement and support

It's important to note that the board does **NOT** get involved in the day-to-day running of the school.

What help do board members get?

NZSTA provides free advice and support to all boards to help them do the very best for their students and community.

We have a dedicated team of advisors who help boards with governance and employment issues.

We also run a comprehensive programme of professional development workshops – most of which are free to attend. They will help you understand your role as a board member and you will gain valuable knowledge and skills.

State Highway 2, Norsewood

Higgins Contractors, on behalf of NZ Transport Agency Waka Kotahi (NZTA), would like to advise you of upcoming roadworks on State Highway 2 (SH2), Norsewood.

What's happening?

On Tuesday 24 June 2025, maintenance work on roadside safety barrier (guardrail) will be completed on SH2, near Coronation Street, Norsewood. This work is expected to take place over a period of 1 day (weather permitting).

Work is scheduled for Tuesday 24 June. Contractors will be working from 7am to 5pm. During work times, the Coronation Street entrance into Norsewood from SH2 will be closed with a detour in place for northbound traffic.

All SH2 traffic heading north Into Norsewood using Coronation Street will be detoured to Hovding Street to Thor Street. We apologise for any inconvenience.

In the event of bad weather, work will begin on the next fine day and may extend the programme out. The purpose of this safety work is to repair the roadside safety barrier.

Thank you for your patience and understanding while we complete this important road maintenance work. We know that a well-maintained state highway network promotes safety and improves options for moving people and freight.
