### **Attendance**

The table below shows the percentage of students at Glenorchy School that attended school regularly (ie, had less than 5 days absent from school a term) over 2024 and 2025. You can see that there was improvement in Term 1 and Term 2 this year from 2024. Term 3 this year was on a par with last year. We are hoping that for this final term of the year we can improve on the 81% from Term 4 2024.

# **Possible Strike Action**

This will allow us to ensure we have adequate supervision and can keep all children safe. Thank you for your understanding and support as we manage the situation. As soon as we have confirmed information we will let you know if the strike is going ahead.


- Gathering and analysing data: Teachers are meticulously compiling and interpreting a wide range of student assessment data to measure progress against learning goals and to identify next steps.
- Making On-balance Judgements: A significant professional responsibility is formulating on-balance judgements. This involves carefully considering a substantial body of evidence including daily work, assessments, observations and student voice to determine a final, accurate overall achievement level for each student. This is a time-intensive process that requires deep professional reflection.
- **Report Writing:** The final detailed student reports require focused time and energy to personalise feedback, articulate achievements, and set goals for the future. This also includes finalizing entries for portfolio books too.

We know this time of year brings a flurry of final questions and requests from parents. We ask that you be mindful and respectful of the demanding workload teachers are managing during this period. While our staff remains committed to open communication, please understand that our capacity for immediate or extended meetings may be limited as we prioritise these critical, non-negotiable end-of-year duties.
