#### **CLASSROOM NEWS:**

#### RUMA KĀKANO

This week in Kākano we have been loving getting outside in the sunshine! We had lots of fun getting creative with the loose parts trailer, and Miss Latta set up some exciting activities for our learning stations outside, including the mud kitchen, building blocks, and the wild animal sandpit.

For shared reading, we have been enjoying the poem The Jelly Bean Tree. We now know it off by heart and acted it out to help us remember. We even planted some jelly beans to see if we can grow our very own jelly bean trees (and, of course, we had to eat a few too!).

In science, we explored some exciting experiments. We made lava lamps using oil, water, and Berocca, and we also tried the "dancing raisins" experiment. It's been a week full of curiosity, creativity, and fun!

















#### **RUMA TUPU**

In Tupu, we have had a busy but exciting short week. On Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday, the children enjoyed the visiting play trailer, getting creative with the loose parts to build houses and invent imaginative games.

Our big book this week was The Enormous Gynormous Hole. We explored new vocabulary such as exaggerate and astonishing, and the children wrote stories imagining what they would do if they were the main character, Milly McGate.

During maths, the children have been continuing to grow their place value knowledge, working with ones, tens, and hundreds.

During Tūhura time, we were thrilled to carry out science experiments, including making a lava lamp and trying the dancing sultanas experiment. The children loved observing the changes and discussing what was happening. We also had fun with some coding challenges using the Bluebots.

#### **CLASSROOM NEWS:**

#### RUMA MĀHURI

Our whole-class reading focus has been on being thankful and showing respect. This was a great gentle reminder about who we can be grateful for and how to show respect to those around us. We learnt new vocabulary words such as worthy, kindness, earn, respect, and polite.

Some of our students also began the novel study Charlotte's Web. This is helping us develop comprehension skills through chapter summaries, follow-up questions, vocabulary exploration, and narrative writing inspired by the story.

We loved joining with Kākano on Wednesday afternoon. We did some buddy reading, singing, dancing and then explored the play trailer together.

We have been practising our football skills in preparation for the tournament on Tuesday. Our discussions have focused on how we communicate with our teammates and how we can support everyone to achieve success.

We have also loved exploring the play trailer. Some tamariki used the equipment to build an obstacle course, while others created buses, houses, and games. It has been wonderful to see them use their risk management skills, be creative, and explore together!

















#### RUMA RĀKAU

A short, but action-packed week in Rākau this week! We welcomed Whaea Ezra to the class; she'll be with us for five weeks on her final teaching practicum. She has settled in well and gotten to know the kids this week, as well as teaching writing and spelling and introducing a STEM unit on bridges.

We had a fun session with Keely from Sport Clutha, who taught us the game Ki O Rahi. It's a fast-paced game that we look forward to practicing and understanding the rules a bit better in the weeks to come.

Always a highlight, the play trailer has been at school this week. It is amazing to see how the children use the loose parts and the fun they can have with basic equipment. The rope swing was a hit again!

We had a lot of our speech presentations on Wednesday. Whaea Ezra and I were impressed with the quality of the speeches and the fact that everybody was able to present theirs in front of the class! It can be a daunting task talking in front of your peers.
