NZEI STRIKE ACTION TO BE CONFIRMED

You may have heard through the media, talk of a possible NZEI strike day on Thursday 23 October. NZEI is the largest union for Primary principals, teachers and support staff. At this stage, strike action has not been confirmed, however an informal strike notification has been presented to schools. If a formal strike notice is received, the school will close on Thursday 23 October as we are unable to provide safe staff:student ratios. For now, please keep this possibility in mind when planning for next week. Further confirmation will follow once an official notice is received.

IMPORTANT SWIMMING PROGRAMME REMINDER

As part of our Health and Physical Education Curriculum, swimming is a compulsory learning area for all New Zealand schools. At St Mark's, we are committed to ensuring every child has the opportunity to develop these essential life skills. Swimming lessons and transport for Year 3–6 students are fully funded, and we also heavily subsidise the Year 0–2 swimming programme so that students of all ages can access lessons in time for the summer holiday period.

Building water confidence, safety awareness, and swimming skills is vital for our tamariki—especially living here in Aotearoa, a beautiful Pacific island nation surrounded by water. We expect all children to take part in swimming lessons. If your child is unable to swim due to medical reasons, please provide a medical certificate. As a general guideline, if your child is too unwell to swim, they are too unwell to attend school that day. We appreciate your continued support in helping every child become confident and safe in and around the water.

SUMMER UNIFORM REMINDERS

Despite the wet weather showing little sign of spring, we know warmer days are on their way! This means our students are now transitioning into summer uniform, which is to be worn in full after Labour Day weekend.
