## **SWIMMING IN TERM 4**

Since our last newsletter, we have secured an alternative swimming venue for our Year 0–2 programme. This change was made in response to ongoing issues around the public changing facilities at Lagoon Pools and the reliance we have on volunteer support, particularly in the male changing area. After visiting the Fulton Swim School, off Ti Rakau drive, it was clear to us that this private venue is much better suited to the needs of our group. We are pleased to let you know that the Year 0–2 swimming programme continues to be heavily subsidised in order to keep costs reasonable for whānau. The financial contribution is \$60 per child for 8 lessons - an intensive course like this would usually cost in excess of \$200.
