


Practical Maths!

We thought it was time for a Board of Trustees mid year update to let you know what has been going on behind the scenes for us so far this year.

- Building works Te Wahapū will be undergoing significant work in the next few months we are still
 waiting on a start date as they will be lifting the classroom and much planning is required. Projects will
 also be undertaken with regard to exterior cladding and flooring.
- We are currently reviewing our Transport Policy and Procedures, our Volunteer Policy and our Administration Policy. We have allocated a sub-committee to do this.
- At the start of 2025, we welcomed Nicola Russell in Te Wahapu learning space. Nicola was appointed as maternity cover for Laura van Leuween and has quickly become part of the Hikuai family.

 outcome. It is the Board's hope that this will be done in time for summer.

 wish Brett and his family all the best as they move on to their next chapter.
- Board of Trustee elections are coming up in September. More information will be coming out about this in the coming weeks. Now is the time to start thinking about putting your name forward if you wish too.
- Emily Ratcliffe has been working hard to get our school signs erected. Sign 1 is positioned on Hikuai Settlement Road, on the way into Pauanui. Sign 2 will be positioned on the corner of SH25 and Morrisons Road in the Clarke's paddock. A big thanks to Storms Contracting for donating the poles and putting them in for us. Emily Ratcliffe's father, Craig who is a professional photographer, did the photography for us and donated his time and editing, Jessie Macaw kindly provided her skills and put the images and writing together and Devan Rowe from Sharp Signs printed the signs for us free of charge.
