Principal's Message

Property Update

Many of you may already be aware that some school projects have been paused while the MOE undertakes a review. Unfortunately, our college is one of those schools. The redevelopment of B Block has been identified as a project which has high cost of delivery and will require an internal review.

MOE has advised that the review will be completed internally by the end of this week. In the meantime the redevelopment will need to pause while the Ministry work through this process. The demolition of C Block will still proceed.

As much as this is frustrating news, be assured that I will continue to work closely with the Board to keep the pressure on the Ministry to complete our rebuild as per the Agreement. We would really appreciate your continued support, whānau.

Phones away for the day

As you may be aware the Government has introduced regulations that require all state schools to put in place school rules regarding the use of phones. The regulations require that schools must ensure students do not use or access a phone while they are attending school, including during lunch time and breaks. This includes students who are on a school course or visit outside the school grounds.

International research indicates that phones in schools are not conducive for learning and for student wellbeing. Therefore, these regulations have been put in place to ensure that the learning of all students is maximised, while minimising any potential for distraction and cyber-bullying.

Our approach is that we recommend students leave their phones at home. If you need to contact your child during school hours, then please ring our school office: (07) 3157022. All messages will be passed on to the rightful person. Any breach of the phone regulation will result in the following:

Phone will be confiscated for the remainder of the day. The student may collect it from the office at the end of school.

Repeated disregard for the rules around phones will result in the phone being confiscated for a longer period of time. Staff discretion. If a phone has been used for bullying purposes, for cyber bullying, to take photos or video record others without their permission, this will result in the phone being confiscated until the end of the term.

Any other serious breaches may result in the phone being confiscated for the year.

In order for the regulations around phones to be effective and not to disrupt our learning programmes, we ask parents/caregivers and whānau to speak to their child about the rules and reinforce the expectations of our college. Parent Representative Vacancy, Board of Trustees
