

# SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY CELEBRATION 2023

During the last week of term 2, Aria School again hosted the interschool **Science and Technology Celebration** at the Aria Hall. This is an initiative started many years ago to encourage schools to promote science investigations and technology problem solving. It is a way for students to investigate and problem solve in practical situations and is open to students from year 1 upwards. Everyone is welcome to come and have a look at the wonderful projects that are displayed; it's a good chance to come and learn from our children.

Over 100 displays from local schools were set up prior to judging which took place on Tuesday 27<sup>th</sup> June. An estimated 200 students from year 1-8 took part in this year's event. Our nine judges had an extremely difficult task even though the judging criteria was specific. It is very pleasing to see that every year the standard of entries improves. Although the projects are judged, the emphasis is on participation.

The hall was open to the public prior to the prizegiving on Wednesday 28<sup>th</sup> June followed by prize giving. The following Āria children received a placing.
