Nau mai, haere mai ki Te Wiki o te Reo Māori! (Welcome to Māori language week!)

THE IMPORTANCE OF LEARNING TE REO MĀORI

Te reo Māori is one of New Zealand's official languages and it is crucial that it is seen as a taonga (treasure) in our classrooms.

The great majority of Māori children develop their learning identities in English- medium primary classrooms. Encountering te reo Māori in their school and classroom helps Māori children feel a sense of belonging and reinforces the belief that they and their culture are important.

Māori students need to see their language and culture visible in their classroom, and preferably in an authentic way. In addition, with New Zealand's biculturalism, embracing te reo in the classroom is important for non-Māori students. It can build empathy and helps to develop well-rounded students. It's also part of schools' obligation to the Treaty of Waitangi and a requirement of meeting the Code of Professional Responsibility and Standards for the Teaching Profession from the Teaching Council.

Does that mean teachers need to be fluent te reo experts? No way! I think it is great for students to see teachers modelling the role of "learner" rather than just being seen as the "classroom expert".

At Āria School all our students start the day celebrating and learning te reo Māori in the library for a 30-minute Te Ao Māori session exploring and practising the reo and listening to traditional stories related to our area, among other things. Our tuakana—teina (Tuakana-teina is a concept from te ao Māori and refers to the relationship between an older (tuakana) person and a younger (teina) person) groupings give all students a chance to be supported to practice their reo daily. This is an amazing way to start our day and always starts and ends with a karakia (blessing) for a happy and fulfilling school day ahead.

This week, as a country, we celebrate Te Wiki o te Reo Māori and we would like to share with you some of the mahi (work) that we have been covering in our daily reo Māori sessions. Keep an eye on our school facebook page for video uploads of the tamariki doing their thing in Te Reo!
