## Science Learning





This term, our students had an exciting opportunity to dive into hands-on learning with the House of Science resource kits. These amazing science boxes are packed with fun, interactive activities that help bring science to life in our classrooms.

We explored three fascinating topics:

- ▲ Electric Circuits Students became young electricians as they experimented with building simple circuits, lighting up bulbs, and discovering how switches work.
- Fossil Fuels In our fossil fuel investigations, students learned where coal, oil, and gas come from, how they're used in our everyday lives, and the environmental impact of using them. We also discussed cleaner, renewable energy alternatives and how we can care for our planet.
- © Climate Change In this unit, we are exploring the science behind climate change. Students are investigating the greenhouse effect, rising sea levels, and the importance of taking action to protect our environment. It is a powerful reminder of the role we all play in creating a sustainable future.

These kits sparked a lot of curiosity and great discussions—plus, the hands-on activities helped us all think like real scientists!

We can't wait to see what next term's kits will bring!
