School Attendance

49% of our recorded absences last term were for medical reasons. Knowing if your child is well enough to go to school can be tricky. Going to school every day is important for all school aged tamariki (children). It helps build their confidence and social skills, and to achieve their education and life ambitions.

Te Whatu Ora / Health New Zealand provide <u>these guidelines</u> to help you decide when it is okay to send your child to school, when you should keep your child at home and when you should contact a health professional for advice.

33% of absences were for holidays taken during term time. Below is a really helpful visual showing the impact these absences have on your child's learning.
