Nature Based Learning Programme

Taieri Beach School's programme involves rich, hands-on quality experiences which encourage our children to enjoy and interact with nature, to learn in nature, about nature and from nature. We have observed the positive effects this Nature Based Learning approach has on our students' well-being, engagement, behaviour and learning. Research into Nature Based Learning has found that the Nature Based Learning approach provides a calmer, more peaceful learning context resulting in students experiencing reduced stress and anxiety, as well as improved concentration, engagement and enjoyment in learning.

We have taken the opportunity while our roll is beginning to grow again, to welcome small groups of children from Mosgiel and Milton schools 2-3 days a week to participate in Nature Based Learning sessions with us. This will start in 2024 and the programme will be organised so our enrolled Taieri Beach School children will receive the full curriculum, but will have the added advantage of more social contact with children their own age. We look forward to the positive benefits for both the Taieri Beach School children and the children from Milton and Mosgiel.

Lawnmowing Procedure

In 2022, 6922 people injured themselves or others while mowing the lawn. This is the highest number of claims through ACC since 2019. Some of these injuries have had lifelong consequences with 21 people needing amputations as a result of a lawnmowing injury.

We welcome the public to use our school grounds during out of school hours. However, to minimise risks to the public's health and safety, whenever the lawns are mown at Taieri Beach School, signs will be placed at both the school gates stating the school grounds are closed while mowing is in progress.
