This Term our Transition class went to Te Anga Paua o Aotearoa National Kapa Haka Competition. The students were incredible and performed in front of a large audience on a big stage at the new Takina Convention Centre in Wellington. It was a huge event that ran over two days with many groups there from throughout Aotearoa/New Zealand. Our group name is Mana Aroha and we have combined with some of the Sommerville vocation programme students this year. We made pois, patus and headbands as part of our preparation. We also printed our own T-Shirts. as well as doing many hours of practice leading up to the event.

Our uniform represents 'Mana-Aroha'- the heart shape represents Aroha and the large koru represents Mana. The protection of the small koru represents our whanau. Our vision is inclusivity and a place of belonging for our neuro diverse roopu from Arahunga School. It is also a goal to maintain connections to our students when they leave us. Our students will be tutoring other teachers and students for Kapa Haka in the future to empower them to lead their own classes.

It has been a wonderful year of kapa haka that has allowed our students to make strong bonds with each other and staff and be included as Maori and Neuro diverse young adults.

We have continued to experience significant roll growth with 29 new students in 2024 and at least another 10 due to enrol with us at the beginning of the 2025 school year. 




Therapy Team

The Therapy Team have been using a large black pop up square sensory tent. This can be folded down, put up and taken down in each classroom. The black tent has a covered door and windows, and has a muscle mat and blanket for comfort.

Inside the tent therapists have been using a range of light up toys and objects to insite language and discussion around the lights, shapes and colours that can be seen in the dark.

The tent has been used to encourage turn taking, sharing, waiting, use of AAC modelling and at times a physical obstacle course to complete before going into the tent.

The tent has been magical for many learners and new language and sensory experiences have been had.



Carlton II

We welcomed two new learners this term, Skylar and Mila. We have five amazing girls. Our theme this term is, Splish Splash and the children have been involved with a lot of water based activities along with mud where we all were able to use some of our focus words dirty, clean, wet and dry, and many more core words. 
