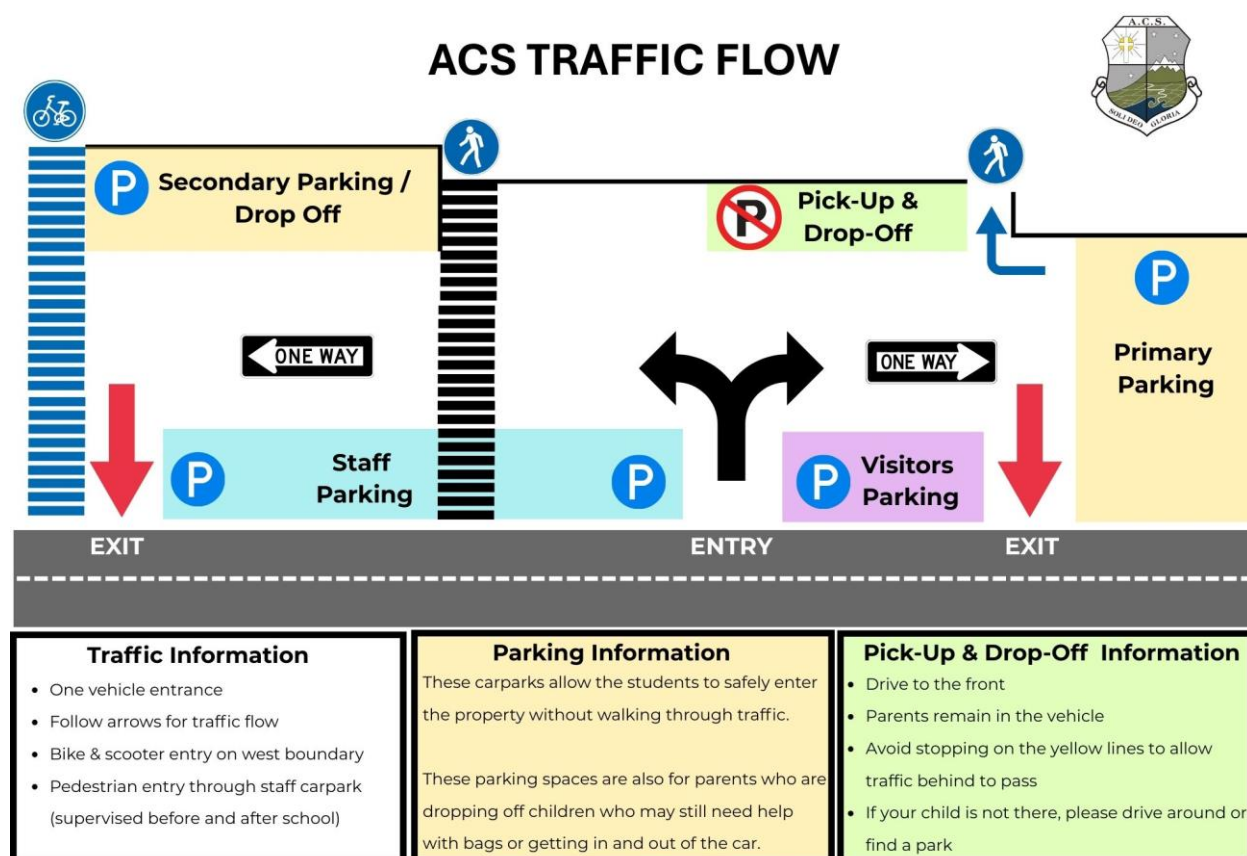

Important Information

The following information has the health and safety of your children at heart. Please support the school in the following measures:

Absences and Lateness

Absences must be reported, either on Skool Loop or by contacting the office, **by 8.45am** on any morning that your child is absent from school. All late children must report to the office.

- **Sickness**

Please do not send your child to school if they are unwell. If your child has a communicable illness (chickenpox, measles etc) or head lice (nits), please notify the office as soon as possible so we can take the appropriate steps to protect others. For vomiting or diarrhea, there is a **48-hour stand-down period** after the **last** episode of sickness before your child can return to school.

- **Extended Holiday**

The Ministry of Education (MOE) provides specific **attendance guidelines** that families must meet to ensure children maintain regular and consistent participation in schooling. If your family plans to take your child out of school for an extended period, please submit a **written request to the Principal** prior to your intended absence.

Animals

Our Animals on School Site Policy will be sent out at the beginning of each year. However, please note: no animals are to be brought on site without prior permission of the Senior Leadership Team.

Behaviour

As a school we seek to encourage and acknowledge positive behaviour. When confronted with misbehaviour teachers seek to identify motives of the heart in each child and respond as wisely as they are able. They seek to instil in ākonga the Biblical principles of Christian living as found in Scripture.

Our school Behaviour Procedure is available on the school website and will be sent home at the beginning of each year.

Before and After School

Ākonga should not arrive at school before **8.30am**. Teachers are outside on duty until 3.15pm. Children are most welcome to stay in the grounds after 3.15pm if supervised by a parent.

Books

All books owned by the school should be cared for and lost or damaged books reported to the class teacher. There is a need for parents to check ākonga's school bags regularly during the school term, to ensure prompt return of readers and library books.

Bus Service

The Mid Canterbury School Transport Service (MCSTS) provides ACS ākonga with a bus service. This is free to all who live 3.2km (age 10 or less) or 4.8km (age 11+) from school. All arrangements and more detailed information is available at MCSTS (www.mcsts.co.nz) or call 03 307 2420.

Cancellations

In the event a trip or event is cancelled due to weather a notice will be posted on Skool Loop.

Complaints Procedures

Our school Complaints Procedure is available on our school website, and will be sent home at the beginning of each year. We encourage parents in the first instance to contact your child's Homeroom teacher.

Damage

Any damage to furniture, fittings, windows or property, whether personal or owned by the school, should be reported immediately to the class teacher. In some circumstances parents may be billed to pay for damage.

Dental Care

Year 0-8 children will receive their dental check-ups at ACS through the School Dental System. Follow-up work is undertaken at Ashburton Community Dental

Service, Cnr Oak Grove and Elizabeth Street. Their operating hours are 8.30am – 4.15pm. Phone 307 6932. Parents receive an appointment card from the dental therapists which will be sent home with the child. **Year 9-13 students need to register with a dentist.**

Emergency Procedures

The school has emergency procedures for a range of possible scenarios including fire, earthquake and emergency lockdowns.

Electronic Devices

Phones

All phones are banned from being brought to school by Year 0-10 ākonga *unless* parents fill out a request form. Where a child has permission to bring a phone, it will be held in secure storage, without student access, throughout the school day. A request form will be e-mailed out in the new year.

Year 11 to 13 students may bring phones to school, but these must be switched off and in bags for the duration of the school day.

NOTE: All devices and accessories (eg earbuds, charging cables, external mice and keyboards) must be clearly named

Homework

We aim to have reasonable and regular homework expectations that support learning in the classroom. We may give extra homework to target areas of specific needs at certain times. The older the child, the more homework they will receive. In Years 9 - 13 ākonga will self-manage, with after school detentions for incomplete work.

Injuries

Injuries are to be brought to the notice of a teacher immediately. For any injury considered serious, parents will be notified, and a record kept.

Interval and Break Time Supervision

Interval is usually supervised by a duty teacher but may also be supervised by a trusted parent, or teacher aide, who has quick access to a teacher.

Leave These Items at Home

Ākonga are not permitted to bring chewing/bubble gum, gum, fizzy drink, chocolate or lollies to school. They are also not permitted to have knives, fireworks, lighters or matches at school. Toys are only permitted for show and tell.

Leaving the School Grounds

Year 0-10 ākonga may not leave the school grounds during school hours without the permission of a teacher. The teacher/office must be informed by the parent of appointments that would necessitate leaving the grounds and ākonga must sign out and back in at the office

Year 11-13 ākonga may walk to the shop at lunch time, in groups of three or more and must sign out and back in at the office.

Litter

All food, paper, plastic, and metal waste is to be taken home in lunch boxes each day.

Lost Property

All clothing, books and sports gear must be clearly named. Lost property is kept in the administration block.

Medication

Parents of ākonga required to take medication need to fill in a medication administering clearance form from the school office. Medication needs to be clearly marked with child's name and dosage instructions. The medication will be locked up in the office for office staff to dispense.

Relationships

No boyfriend/girlfriend relationships are permitted in school, but, rather, ākonga are encouraged to care for one another as brothers and sisters ought to.

Road Safety

Caregivers must ensure their child is safe on the roads before allowing them to walk or cycle. The school has a road safety programme. We recommend no ākonga cycle to school before the age of 11. Helmets are compulsory in NZ. We recommend helmets for ākonga on scooters as well.

Sign In

It is important that ALL visitors to school (including parents) sign in at the office between the hours of 9 am and 3pm. If you are collecting your child during the school day, or dropping an item to your child, please come to the office first.

Ākonga who leave or arrive during the school day must also sign (or be signed by a parent) in or out.

This does not include normal pick up and drop off times or pre-advertised events such as assemblies or sports days.

Stationery

Class stationery lists can be found on pages 18-25. It is each family's responsibility to ensure children have the right stationery.

You may purchase your orders in retail stores. Paper Plus, Office Spot and The Warehouse Stationery all hold up to date stationery lists for each class.

Sun Smart

The school provides sunscreen. **School** hats are compulsory in Terms 1 and 4 for Year 1-6 ākonga each lunch time.

Unexpected School Closures

In the event of an unexpected school closure (e.g. extreme weather conditions) announcements will be made via Skool Loop.

Attendance Dues for 2026 are \$1700 per student.

- **The Christian Schools Trust (CST) - Attendance Dues Payments**

Hair

Year 0-10 - Hair is to be tidy and clean, kept off the face and tied back if below the collar. Use only plain burgundy, white or black coloured hair ties, clips or bobbles.

Girls in Year 11 – 13 do not need to tie their hair back except when necessary for safety reasons (eg Science, Technology or Physical Education)

Boys' hair is to be tidy and clean with the hair off the collar and face. Hair longer than the collar needs to be tied back.

Hair additives must not change the natural colour of the hair. The Principal will arbitrate where there is doubt.

Jewellery

Year 0-10 students are not permitted to wear jewellery, make-up or nail polish at school except for a small, plain stud or sleeper in the earlobe for girls. It is the responsibility of parents to ensure that this regulation is kept.

Year 11-13 students are permitted to wear the following jewellery: one wristwatch, one bracelet, one ring, one stud or small sleeper in each earlobe, one neck chain or taonga. All other jewellery will be asked to be removed, including facial piercings.

Year 11 – 13 girls may wear natural makeup and nail polish.
