
<u>Property news:</u> - Dayna is digging a drain outside of Te Mataahae so that we can stop the water pooling outside of their classroom.

Dayna is also working on repairing some of the pool exterior – please stay away from this area while the "danger" tape is up. Thank you.

<u>Sickness</u> – School sores/impetigo are going around. We only have a few children with them, but they are highly contagious. If you notice a scratch or mamae on your child has become infected, it might be a school sore. If you're unsure, please take your child to the chemist straight away. They will give you some cream to put on and some advice for any next steps (e.g. taking a day off school, or having to go to the doctor if it requires antibiotics). #### **Heads up:**

- **Kutu/Nits** please check your child's head on a daily basis for nits. We have children from multiple classes who are itching. We have treatments at school please see Rachel or Roseanne for treatments. Please tie your child's hair up if it is long. Thank you.
- School Start and Finish & Attendance: Please remember that school begins at 9am and finishes at 3pm. It's important children are at school every day and on time. However, we would rather children were at school late than not at all. Getting to school by 9am is important for children's routines. Thank you.
- MUD! A reminder to give young children a change of clothes especially pants. If
  your child comes up to the office wet and muddy and we have run out of clothes
  to put them in, we will call you to come and collect them. Thank you.
- Absences: If your child is not going to be at school, please advise the office via text on 0275269552, or via the Skool Loop app. Make sure you tell us the reason they are absent.



- o Front gates are closed all day from 9.30am-3.10pm. We will cross children over at the end of the day. Please use the "crossing".
- Back gates: These are locked during the day and will be opened again at 3pm. There will be two walking bus teachers to walk your children to the intersection of Hillside Drive, Moeraki, and Norana Roads and will be crossed over by the road patrollers.
- **Breakfast Club:** Runs 5 days per week from 8 9.30am. We are always in need of volunteers for Breakfast Club please. If you would like to volunteer for this job, please advise Roseanne or Rachel at the office. Thank you.
- Lunches in Schools: We provide lunches each day. The kai will be offered to every child. All children are expected to at least try the kai.
- Water only: We are a water only school which means children can only drink water while they are at school. We would encourage your child to bring a drink bottle of water each day.
- Assemblies: We hold our weekly celebration Assembly on Fridays at 9am. All whanau are welcome to attend.

#### MINOR AILMENTS SCHEME, LOWER HUTT

We want to help people in the Hutt Valley to access healthcare for minor illnesses where and when they need it.

Pharmacists can help to support the health of your family; they can provide advice and treatment for common minor illnesses for all ages.

The minor health conditions service (also referred to as minor ailments), launched in Upper Hutt in December 2022, is now available in several Lower Hutt pharmacies. This service enables eligible people to consult with a pharmacist at selected local pharmacies, and if appropriate, access free approved medicine.

## The service is to help people with minor illnesses to access healthcare at a pharmacy and is available for:

- Children under 14 years of age, and whānau members\* (any age), with the same symptoms
- Community services card (CSC) holders
- Māori and pacific people

\*For example, if the pharmacist gives your tamariki medicine for scabies and you, or brothers or sisters also have symptoms, they may give advice and medicine to all of you.

#### The conditions that pharmacists can help you with include:

- Skin ailments (nits, eczema, scabies, fungal infections)
- Eye inflammation
- Dehydration (usually from vomiting and diarrhoea).

In most cases, bookings are not required, phone or pop in to see your friendly community pharmacist. All advice and treatment is conducted in a professional and confidential manner.

Remember a pharmacist can provide advice on, and treat common and minor illnesses with a range of medications. The pharmacist will refer patients to a GP or other health care service if the patient's condition requires it.
