Kia ora, Talofa Lava, Mālō e lelei, Kia orana, Namaste, Kumusta,

Ngā mihi o te tau hou - happy New Year, and welcome back to everyone. Settle in for a big read!

We are so excited to be back at school. Teachers have worked over the break to create a great learning environment for everyone to be in. We are looking forward to another year of hard work and learning heaps – and I don't mean just students. Teachers will be completing professional development this year in literacy and mathematics, as they were last year. Learning doesn't stop.

<u>Nau mai, haere mai to our newbies</u>: Whaea Ryleigh who is teaching in Te Hikuwai; Anasitasia who has started in Te Pūao; Esa, Tali, Titus, Grayson and Lincoln who have started in Te Waipuna, and Ngārāitekahurangi who has started in Ngā Pōtiki.

<u>Newsletters this year</u>: There will be a change this year – we will be sending out newsletters fortnightly instead of weekly. We will send home a printed version of the newsletter to your oldest or only child as well as putting it on our Facebook page, and will send via Skool Loop.

Data from 2024:

The results of our data analysis from 2024 showed that our children's progress in literacy and numeracy is overall accelerating. This is due to :1) your children working hard, 2) your teachers working hard, 3) intervention programmes we have in place for some students, including teacher aide support and small group support. Our Board has contributed a lot of money to ensuring that we have intervention programmes in place.

We are heartened by these results as it reflects how much effort we have put into our mahi, but we still have a way to go as by the end of 2025, we want at least 80% of our children to be working at or above their cohort level in reading, writing, and maths. The reason we are working so hard on the 3Rs is because they are the gateway to accessing the rest of the curriculum. If you can read and write, you can do anything and be anything you want to be. When you achieve well in mathematics, it helps you to understand the world around you. Anyone can learn mathematics, and we always make sure we have a growth mindset around our learning saying, "I might not be able to achieve it YET, but if I keep trying, I will!"



Attendance:

The government is cracking down on truancy in schools. We are now required to report to the Ministry of Education each day on our attendance. While we have always contacted parents/carers of children who are not at school via either text or phone, you may notice an increase in correspondence from me via emails, a visit

to your home, and more phone calls. We are not in the business of judging you, but we are in the business of educating your child and need them to be at school on time and each day. It's important to us that your child reaches their potential. We will always expect children to be at school every day, unless they are unwell. If they are going to be absent from school, you need to contact us please. Thank you.

Lunches in Schools:

You may have heard loads in the media about the Lunches in Schools programme, and probably thinking your child will be having no lunch until 3pm. Not true. We are lucky to have 3 providers who are really switched on and have managed to get lunches to us right on time. Yesterday there was delicious lasagna and a side of veggie chips, and today a sandwich,

chips and a cookie. The quality of the food shouldn't change, but we may see a reduction in the sides provided. It is our policy to encourage children to at least try the food, and we will always put the school lunches in front of them. Children are monitored for 10 minutes from 1-1.10pm to make sure they have eaten something from the lunches or their lunch boxes.

Bake Sale Valentine's Day:

We are holding a bake sale next Friday 14th February (Valentine's Day) at morning teatime to fundraise for UHUB. UHUB was created by schools for the Upper Hutt community to support whānau raising children up to 12 years old. They have information that can help including advice around health, cultural matters, child development, education, and parenting. Our school would like to be able to contribute financially to UHUB and would like to raise at least \$500, which is about \$4 per child. We would appreciate your support – please bring baking and money along next Friday 14th Feb. Thank you so much for your support.
