Back Gates:


- Our back gates are locked now during the day from 9am-2.55am.
- They are locked to keep children safe from leaving the playground.
- The gates will be unlocked at 2.55pm please wait to collect your children until then.
- For health and safety reasons, do not allow your child to climb the fence.
- If you need to get into the school, go to the front gate entrance.
- If you have any queries, please call the office 0275269552.
- It is not unusual for schools to have to lock their gates. I don't know of one primary school in Upper Hutt who doesn't lock all gates bar one all to keep their kids safe. We've just been very spoilt until now that we haven't needed to lock our back entrance.
- Staff do not have keys on their person, and we will not be coming down to unlock the gate unless there is an emergency.

<u>Nits</u> have made a huge come back in the last week. Any time we see an adult nit in your child's hair (we will not go hunting for them – it's just if we see them crawling), we will ask you to take them home to be treated. The second treatment usually needs to be about 3 days afterwards, to catch the adults that have hatched after your last treatment. It's a good idea for your child to have their long hair tied up. Don't share combs or brushes. We recommend you check their heads each night. Combing with conditioner is a great way to

keep on top of them and getting rid of the eggs. We have combs, conditioner, and nit treatments here if you require them. Just let us know.

There is no shame in having nits – it's not as though nits choose dirty or clean hair. Nits just love human blood and will swing happily from one head to another. Keep on top of the treatments please, and with the holidays coming up, we might be free of them for term 3. Thank you.

<u>Kaupapa mō te wīkī/Value of the week:</u> <u>Atawhai/Kindness:</u> We are remembering to use our manners. We say 'please' if we would like something, and "ngā mihi/thank you" if we receive something.

Year 4-8 Trip to the Movies: Our year 4-8 students are going to Monterey Cinemas on a double decker bus tomorrow, Wednesday 26th June to watch "The Mountain". It is rated PG which means it is recommended for all ages, however there are some themes such as illness and death are discussed on the movie. While we consider this a low-risk trip and therefore covered under the "Low Risk permission form", we would ask that you talk to your child about the movie to see how they are feeling about the messages in the movie, which are about friendships and loyalty, and connecting with ancestors.

Heads up:

- <u>Back Gates</u>: are now locked. They are locked from 9am in order to keep students inside
 the gates. They will be opened again at 2.55, so please wait until the gates are opened –
 don't climb the fence. If you want to pick your child up earlier, go to the front gate. Thank
 you.
- School Start and Finish & Attendance: Please remember that school begins at 9am and finishes at 3pm. It's important children are at school every day and on time. Getting to school by 9am is important for children's routines. Thank you.
- <u>Winter Mud:</u> Children who wish to play on the grass and in the mud to wear gumboots and bring a change of clothes. Please help us by putting a change of clothes in your child's bag, and encouraging them to wear gumboots at this time of the year. Thank you.



- <u>Illness:</u> Colds, sore throats, coughs, and tummy bugs are still around. Just a reminder that if your child presents with any cold or flu symptoms, please keep them at home so we can try to prevent the spread of the bugs. Keep testing for Covid if they test positive, they need to stay away from school for 5 days from their first symptoms. Please keep us in the loop with your child's illness thank you.
- <u>Lateness</u> a reminder please that if your child comes to school late, they need to come to the office so we can record them as attending for the day. Thank you.
- Absences: If your child is not going to be at school, please advise the office via text on 0275269552, or via the Skool Loop app. Make sure you tell us the reason they are absent.
- Entry in to and from School: Mornings drop your child off at the front gate or the back.
 Our carpark can be quite full and it's safer to drop your child off at the gate and have them walk in. You do not need to drop them to the office unless they are running late thank you.
 End of the day
 - Front gates are closed all day from 9am-3.10pm. We will cross children over at the end of the day. Please use the "crossing".
 - Back gates: There will be two walking bus teachers to walk your children to the intersection of Hillside Drive, Moeraki, and Norana Roads and will be crossed over by the road patrollers.
- **Breakfast Club:** 5 days per week from 8 9.30am. We require help on a **Thursday** please. If you would like to volunteer for this job, please advise Roseanne or Rachel at the office. Thank you.
