## **Board Elections:**

- Every three years all public schools in Aotearoa hold elections for their School Boards, and this is going to happen again in 2025. If you are interested in sharing your skills with us, be ready to put your name forward.
- Being a part of a school board is an important role that needs people with a range of skills, experiences and attributes who believe in making a positive difference to our children's learning. We encourage you to think about this and how your experiences and attributes might benefit the board.

- Election date is **Wednesday 10<sup>th</sup> September**, and an email will be going out to you all this week regarding calling for nominations for parent candidates. These nominations will close on **Wednesday 6 August 2025.**
- The School Board is a key part of our kura because they do a lot of important things behind the scenes. Our School Board write our strategic plan, consult with our community about things that matter, make sure our finances are being spent wisely and ensure that we are giving effect to Te Tiriti o Waitangi.
- Our board is made up of 5 parent vacancies, the Principal, and a staff rep elected by the staff.
- The board have appointed a Returning Officer, Schooled Election Pilot.
- Important things like the nomination and voting forms will be sent to you by email directly by Schooled. If we don't have an email address for you don't stress, because Election Pilot will send these out to you by post so you don't miss out. There are a lot of rules around how elections need to be run.
- Your name and contact details have been provided to Schooled Election Pilot to enable them to deliver elections services for our kura as required by legislation. They will use your contact details for the provision of election services for Te Kura o Hau Karetu only, and your details will be deleted 60 days after the election date as required by legislation. If you have any questions about the election process, then the best people to talk to are the team at Election Pilot. You can contact the Returning Officer directly on 0800 VOTENZ (0800 868 369) or election@electionpilot.nz.
- We will continue to keep you updated through the various stages of the election process.

#### <u>Heads up:</u>


