Outside of school, I enjoy working in my gardens, reading, running after three cats and going for drives with my husband.





Items your child needs to bring to school...

Stationery

This year our stationery lists came home with your child's report last year. If you need another copy they can be found on our school website - scroll through to find the correct year level or order the packs through Qizzle



Hats

Our school policy is that in term 1 and 4 the students **MUST** wear a hat when they are outside the classroom. Please ensure your child has a named hat at school each day. If your child can leave a hat at school each day, that would be appreciated.



Drink bottle

Please ensure that your child has a **NAMED** drink bottle. In this weather it is important to keep hydrated.

Swimming togs

All our students participate in swimming in Term 1. Our Year 0-3s use our school pool and our Y4-6s students participate in community swimming at Papatoetoe Centennial pools once a week.

The classroom teacher will let you know what days their class is swimming so you know when your tamariki need their togs.

Students should bring their book bag each day.

You will notice the purchase of a T-shirt is on the stationery list, which can be purchased at school for \$19.50. If your child still fits their one from last year, they don't require a new one!

Zero-waste healthy snacks
