Through playful singing games, students have explored pitch, melody, and musical expression in fun, interactive ways that promote both individual participation and group harmony.



They've also been learning to recognise and create rhythm using a range of simple percussion instruments, developing their timing, coordination, and ability to follow patterns. These hands-on experiences not only build musical skills but also enhance students' focus, memory, and collaboration.

Beyond classroom time, our Block 3 and break time programmes have continued to thrive. Tamariki have enjoyed the chance to be part of our vibrant Performing Choir. Our ukulele Club has also been strumming along with enthusiasm, giving students a chance to develop instrumental skills in a relaxed and supportive setting.

#### **Room 26 Explores Volcanoes!**

Students in Room 26 have been learning all about volcanoes through their inquiry topic. As part of their learning, they created stunning volcano paintings using bold colours and textures. Alongside their artwork, students have been sharing interesting facts—did you know some volcanoes are active, dormant, or extinct? One fun fact they discovered: Auckland is built on a volcanic field made up of over 53 volcanoes—including Mount Eden and Rangitoto Island!



#### Rūma 27's Explorers at Kohuora Park

Room 27 had a wonderful opportunity to learn more about our adopted Kohuora Park, guided by environmentalist Frazer. The students took part in a fun scavenger hunt and used binoculars to spot native birds and plants around the park. They also learned how to keep Kohuora Park clean and care for the environment. Outdoor learning is always fun and motivating!

We have been making new friends while we learn. We have loved celebrating the cultural weeks and seeing performances in the hall. In our class we make learning fun!



#### Rūma 29 - Learning with Rakau Sticks for Matariki

As part of our Matariki learning, our class explored  $t\bar{t}t\bar{t}$   $t\bar{o}rea$  — a traditional Māori stick game. We used wooden sticks ( $t\bar{t}t\bar{t}$ ) to learn patterns, actions, and rhythm while singing the waiata E Papa Waiari. These games were once used by Māori to help improve coordination and teamwork. The tamariki loved the challenge of keeping in time and working together!





## Rūma 30 - Volcano Models of Tamaki Makaurau

Based on Jaime's model that she designed herself at home, Rūma Toru Tekau made mini volcanoes to demonstrate how the volcanoes have changed our landscape in Tamaki Makaurau. We are so glad that 52 of Auckland's volcanoes are extinct and Rangitoto is dormant. Thanks Jaime for the inspiration.







#### TE KAKANO (Rūma 9 & 11)

Tamariki in both classes have had an awesome term of learning about volcanoes around the Auckland area. The trip to Maungakiekie was filled with wonder, chatter and laughter. Little legs were tired by the time they worked up and down the maunga. Exploring the different rocks that were brought into school by the Auckland Museum, Volcano in a Van prompted questions and lively discussions. Touching the rocks made the learning real for them.
