










Year 1 update

Ruma Rua Tekau Mā Iwa have been working hard on their phonics! The children are great at sounding out words, learning new digraphs, and reading and writing the words they know. They are becoming more confident writers and love









Ruma rua tekau ma rima are so enthusaitc about PMP! We have been making fantastic progress in MP sessions this term! Year 1 students been building their balance, coordination, and spatial awareness through fun activities. It's been wonderful to see Year 1 students confidence grow as they move through each station and work on key skills that support both their physical and classroom learning.









Ruma Rua tekau ma waru have been busy using materials in maths to reinforce understanding of concepts and mathematical language. Using outside play equipment, we had a 'good-guess' to estimate sets of objects like 100 and 10. We practiced memorizing important phone numbers. We can show our even numbers. We can gather and make sets of tens and ones.



Ruma toru tekau love to READ! We have been learning to monitor our own reading. To check two things, firstly that our reading looks right and secondly that it makes sense. Our class loves to put on puppet shows, do alphabet puzzles and read, read, **READ!!**
