






Rūma 26



SCHOOL UNIFORM 2025

Dear Whānau.

The Papatoetoe West School Board is pleased to announce that, in addition to our current supplier, Angel Fashions, we are now offering uniform options through our new supplier, NZ Uniforms. This initiative is part of our ongoing efforts to provide high-quality, durable uniform choices for our students.

As we introduce these new options, we'd like to take this opportunity to remind families about our footwear and sock expectations, which will be more consistently applied starting from Term 1, 2025. Your support in helping students transition to wearing the appropriate footwear in line with these guidelines is greatly appreciated.

We understand that this may require some families to make small adjustments, and we thank you for your cooperation in ensuring that students meet these footwear expectations. Through our partnership with KidsCan, with adequate notice, we are able to provide appropriate school shoes for any families that would like support with this. This can be arranged through our school office.

From 2025, we will be more actively supporting students to follow these guidelines. Thank you for your ongoing support in maintaining smart, safe, and consistent uniform standards for all students.

Footwear Guidelines:

- Main Shoe Type: Students are required to wear plain black lace-up shoes or Velcro fastened shoes. These shoes should be sturdy, comfortable, and suitable for everyday school activities.
- Sandals: Students may wear plain black sandals with a secure back strap, such as Roman sandals or school sandals, which provide comfort and support while maintaining a neat appearance.

Sock Guidelines:

 Plain black or navy blue, with no logos or patterns visible.









Footwear Not Allowed:

- Casual footwear like crocs
- Heelys
- Open-toed shoes
- Ballet flats
- Jandals
- Sandals without a back strap
