Thank you to everyone who responded to our Community Survey. This information gives us a sense of understanding of what our priorities might encompass over the next 3 years for Waituna West School. The survey has now closed.

We have embarked on a recycling programme to reduce our waste, throughout the last 12 months we have focussed on cardboard and paper, Mrs Robertson has been transporting our leftover items to the recycling centre and all classes are careful to ensure non-paper items go in the general waste collection. We will no longer be burning rubbish but instead ensuring our carbon footprint is reduced as much as possible. We have been enrolled in the 'Paper For Trees' programme which is sponsored by the Manawatu District Council. Through our recycling effort we were eligible for 20 native trees which were delivered to us last term.

These will be used to plant out the bike track area and enhance the biodiversity of our environment. We look forward to increasing our recycling effort over the coming months.
