- Some of the schools had only 1 classroom and students were in the same class for the whole time they were at primary school.
- There was a 9 hole golf course at Tapuae. After the golf course closed the building was shifted to Waituna West School. It became the hall. Later it was shifted again and is now the Playcentre building.
- The maypole we still use came from Tapuae School
- The Waituna West school colours were still red and black.
- The hall used to be down in the village and students had to walk down to it. The road became too busy to have students walking on. The community did fundraising to move the hall to its current place.
- The Playcentre car park used to be the horse paddock.
- The New Zealand Prime Minister at the time, Robert Muldoon, flew to Waituna West to open the water
- scheme. It all got washed away in the 2004 floods.
 The playground area used to be very small and students were not allowed to go out on the back field.
- After being away from Waituna West for a while and seeing other parts of the world a previous student realised how fortunate we are to be living in an area like Waituna West and going to Waituna West School!
