PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Nau mai hoki mai, Fakaalofa atu and welcome back to Term 4 Helensville Primary School whānau. Term 4 is a time for us as a school to come together and celebrate the year that we have had. It is a time for us to acknowledge students, staff, and our wider school community for all the hard work that we have put into the year for which we are all grateful for.

He waka eke noa 'A canoe which we are all in with no exception'

This whakatauki explains how 'we are all in this together'. Where is the waka heading (vision/mission)? What is the waka made of (values/principles)? How do we work well together to paddle the waka most effectively (collaboration)? It can be interpreted in many ways, but it encourages us to explore the most effective ways to work together and shows us what is needed to proceed.

This well known whakatauki speaks to how last term, we collected feedback from our parent community around the things that they value. Over the next few newsletters I will be sharing your responses to this survey regarding our strategic planning for the next few years. The responses we received were very powerful, and will help us shape the direction of the school over the next few years.

In this newsletter I will share the main themes from the data we collected to Question 1 "What do you believe are the strengths of Helensville Primary School?" and the 'School Communication Section'. Below is a summary:

For **Question 1**, an overwhelming response was what a strong sense of 'community' our school has. This is something that I agree wholeheartedly with and have experienced this right from the time I started here as principal. Another strong theme present were the many 'opportunities' the school provides such as- culture, sports, academics. This is something that we as a school need to hold on to and nurture moving forward.

For the **School Communication section**, approximately 80% of the responses were very positive and at the upper end of the continuum (points 7 - 10) when asked about the school newsletter, email and text system, and online apps (Seesaw, Facebook and Skool Loop). What we did note was that the responses were not as positive regarding our School Website, where around 50% of the responses were in the middle of the continuum (points 4 - 7). Because of this, we are currently looking at revamping our school website to make it more user friendly.

Next weekend Saturday 28th October 10:00am - 2:00pm we have our 2023 Whānau Fun Fair. Our amazing PATHS team have been working tirelessly to organise this and bring it all together. Don't forget there is always the Teacher Dunk and Pie in the Face stalls which our staff obviously absolutely love!
