PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Kia ora, talofa lava, kia orana, fakaalofa lahi atu, ni sa bula vinaka, malo e lelei, namaste, welkom, ayubowan, sannu and warm greetings to all our Helensville School whānau for 2025.

Firstly, I would like to extend a very warm welcome to our new families, I look forward to meeting with you over this term so please pop in and see me if ever you have time for a chat. A few new classroom teachers have joined us this year, and we are excited about the wealth of knowledge and skills that they bring and will share with us. We also welcome back Matua Glen who was on study leave all of last year, he returns to his position as Deputy Principal of the Senior School.

I would like to humbly acknowledge all our families who were able to attend the beautiful Whakatau on Monday, thank you for taking time out of your busy schedules to be present for this very important occasion. To all our speakers on the day, your words were delivered with eloquence and mana, kia ora rawa atu!

There have been a few changes to Helensville School for 2025 in terms of structure and organisation. A big change was the relocation of the junior area of the school nearer to the admin block. This was the original location, and we will monitor this closely to see how our junior students respond to this. We have also created across-school curriculum teams for Literacy, Mathematics, and Physical Education / Sport. This is to support our teachers in adhering to all the new Ministry of Education directives concerning professional learning and development, assessment and reporting, and implementation of the refreshed NZ Curriculum in some areas.

It is going to be a big year for all schools across the motu to deliver on all these changes. I mentioned to our teaching staff at one of our Teacher Only Days at the start of the year that this year is going to be full of challenges for us to navigate. As a school we are well-placed in regards to delivering on these directives, but our teachers will be under a lot of pressure. Having said this, I have full faith in our teaching staff to ensure we are on top of everything. On this note I would like to reference this whakataukī:

"He kai kei aku ringa"

This whakataukī signifies resilience, empowerment and hope.

We are still awaiting clarification and confirmation from the Ministry of Education on new reporting guidelines. How we will be reporting to you this year may or may not look different from other years. We will keep you informed and updated as much as possible.

Our 2025 school calendar is full of many fun and exciting events, so please ensure you have the caregivers app loaded so that you don't miss any important notices.

Road Safety Message

We all know that parking is limited around Helensville Primary School and there is little that we can do about it. What we can control is our own driver behaviour. Our combined attention to traffic safety and ongoing courtesy to others at the school drop off and pick up is what ensures that all our tamariki get to and from school safely. We all have a role to play in this. I would like to thank those of you who already understand this and always park legally.

I have received numerous complaints from locals about the driving or parking behaviour of parents from our school community over the years I have been here as Principal. Most of these complaints have been about drivers parking on yellow lines near the school, or of poor driving around pick up and drop off times down our narrow surrounding streets. This is in addition to the conversations I've had with individual parents while I have been on duty in the mornings and after school. A few notes about Yellow Lines and Pedestrian Crossings are below:

Yellow Lines

Yellow lines tell drivers that they can't stop there. They are there to make sure that all road users can see other traffic and pedestrians, as well as our tamariki on Road Patrol being able to see all traffic and do their job safely. There is no exception for "just a minute". Drivers must remember that the yellow lines are there to keep everyone safe, and can't be ignored just for the sake of their own convenience.

Pedestrian Crossings


At Helensville School we monitor two pedestrian crossings, one on Rata Street and one on Garfield Road. Our tamariki only do Road Patrol for our Rata Street crossing. When Road Patrol is operating drivers may not need to stop for waiting pedestrians as the Road Patrollers will wave them on and hold pedestrians until there is a break in the traffic. This keeps traffic flowing. Drivers need to pay close attention to crossings nearby schools at the start and finish of the school day to notice whether or not a Road Patrol is operating. If there is no Road Patrol, then drivers and riders must follow the road rules for a pedestrian crossing.


We have always taken a positive educational approach to road safety around the school, but this does not seem to be making much of a difference as easily avoidable road safety concerns are still permitting. We would not want to change this to a punitive approach and organise the authorities to start doing checks and issuing tickets around pick-up and drop-off times, but we may very well need to if these driving behaviours do not improve. At the end of the day, all of this is for the safety and well-being of our children.
