



## Hihi Class Focus

## History Topic:

This Term Hihi Class has been learning about how things have changed over time. We looked at how household items, technology, chores, schools, communication and transport have changed.

As part of this study, we also looked at Toys and Games. We learned about some games from the past and had a lot of fun learning how to play elastics, knucklebones, clapping games, hop scotch, rakau, poi and string games. We compared these games to games we play today. We thought that games from the past were harder and more challenging, but they were also a lot of fun. We thought games we play today were generally a bit easier to play. We also thought about what games might look like in the future. We had some great ideas, such as drone riding, drone tag and remote controlled sports!















#### Maths:

Last week in Hihi Class, we had a focus on measurement. We found out about different units of measurement (feet, hands, cubes, and centimetres). We discussed the best unit of measurement for things around the classroom and had a go at measuring them. We learnt the importance of lining the unit of measurement up to the zero, or the very start of what we were measuring, and about ensuring the units had no spaces between them.










Recently, we have also been learning about patterns and number bonds to 10. Some of us have also learned about a family of facts. We tried writing the same problem in 4 different ways (e.g., 8+2=10, 2+8=10, 10-8=2, 10-2=8).

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
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
