I found this post made by a school principal on his school's Facebook page. Makes for some interesting reading.

Kia Ora Koutou

School is about to start for 2024, so I am asking you to please sit down with your tamariki for just 5 minutes and explain that being very tall, short, chubby, skinny, black or white is no joke, and that you should not tease other kids if you think they are one of those!

That there is nothing wrong with wearing the same shoes every day, or in fact wearing no shoes at all!.

Explain to them that a used backpack, or brown paper bag carry the same dreams, and do the same job as a new one,

Teach them not to exclude someone because they are "different" or do not have the same opportunities as others. Explain that teasing hurts...and that they go to school to LEARN, NOT to compete.

<u>Ash Wednesday – Wednesday 14 February</u>

Ash Wednesday is one of the most important holy days in the liturgical calendar. It marks the beginning of Lent, a season of fasting and prayer.

Ash Wednesday is 46 days before Easter Sunday. During the Mass the Priest puts ashes in the shape of a cross on the forehead. The ashes symbolise the dust from which God made us and grief that we have sinned. The Church asks that we are prayerful, reflective and seek penance during the time of Lent.

The ashes are made from the blessed palms used in the Palm Sunday Celebrations from the previous year.
