Our Commitment to Te Tiriti o Waitangi

You may be aware that Parliament is currently considering changes to the Education and Training Act that would remove the requirement for schools to "give effect to Te Tiriti o Waitangi" in policy and curriculum.

At St Joseph's School, we want to reassure our community that this change will **not** affect our commitment to Te Tiriti o Waitangi.

As a Catholic school, our values guide us to honour tangata whenua and support all students to grow in their identity and understanding of who they are. Our long history of integrating te reo Māori, tikanga Māori, and local history into school life will continue.

The Board remains committed to supporting staff with ongoing professional learning to deepen our understanding of Te Tiriti o Waitangi and culturally responsive practice. This helps ensure that our teaching honours each child's identity, heritage, and potential.

We are guided by our Catholic faith and our SAINT values, and will continue to:

- Support our tamariki to feel proud of their identity and whakapapa
- Teach our shared local history
- Include karakia, te reo and tikanga Māori in daily school life
- Work closely with whānau to build strong partnerships
- Help all tamariki flourish in both Te Ao Māori and Te Ao Katorika

This is not a political stance—it reflects who we are as a school and our ongoing commitment to doing what is right for our children, whānau and community.
