Dear Parents and Caregivers,

My thoughts are still with the Hawkes Bay and other affected areas that were devastated by Cyclone Gabrielle. This week I shared a link onto our Rangitoto School facebook page regarding McIndoes and Te Kuiti Meats transporting donated goods to the Hawkes Bay to help those in need. The media and social media images that are circulating of the houses and towns that have been destroyed are heartbreaking to see. Next Wednesday, Rangitoto School is dressing up in black and white to show our support and help towards those affected by the cyclone. As these communities that have been affected by the cyclone dig deep to try to rebuild their homes, businesses and lives, they will need to find their inner strength and a whole lot of resilience to get through these tough times.
