Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Isn't it incredible that the term is flying by so quickly, we have two weeks of school left until we break for the Easter holidays.

Last week our students had a wonderful end to the bike week with our annual triathlon. Our students put 100% into their swimming, biking and running. There were some challenging moments for some students on the course, where bikes skidded out or their seats malfunctioned. I heard a few comments as the bikers jumped off their bikes in the transition area "my legs are jelly and don't work!" Our resilient students pushed through and carried on running to finish their running leg with red hot cheeks. It was awesome to see every student successfully finish their triathlon race.

Then, on Friday the whole school headed off to The Science RoadShow which was held at Te Kuiti High School. The students loved watching two interactive live shows:

- **Mighty Materials** Physical and chemical properties of substances, such as metals and fabrics, and how these are put to use in everyday applications.
- **Sounding Out Waves** The characteristics of sound such as pitch, volume, how fast it travels, what substances it travels through, how it travels and the many effects these have on things we can or cannot hear.

The students particularly enjoyed watching Mrs Reynolds and Miss Coleman wear velcro suits and trying to un-attach themselves from each other. There were over 60 hands-on exhibits that students enjoyed learning about.


