As teachers began presenting their class awards for academic achievement, effort, and positive behaviour, I noticed a clear and consistent pattern: many of the students receiving these awards were the very same students who had earlier received attendance certificates. This observation wasn't planned or prompted — it simply reinforced what we already know to be true: **regular attendance plays a vital role in student success.**

Being at school consistently allows students to stay engaged, keep up with learning, and build strong relationships with their peers and teachers. Every day matters. Even one or two days missed can lead to gaps that are hard to catch up on, especially in subjects that build on each lesson.

We understand that illnesses and family emergencies can't always be avoided, but we deeply appreciate your efforts to prioritise school attendance wherever possible.
