# ATTENDANCE MATTERS

### LATE COMERS TO SCHOOL

Student attendance, along with effective teaching, has the greatest influence on student engagement and achievement. All students must be present at school **ON TIME** so they can participate and engage in learning.

Currently we are experiencing far too many late-comers and as such teachers from Monday will be taking note of students who are coming late.

Students who are regular late-comers will have home phone calls and possible follow ups with Attendance Services. Students coming to school on time is the responsibility of the parent. Ref: Al Madinah School

#### ABSENCES

If a student is going to be absent for the day, a parent/ caregiver should let the school office know BEFORE 8.30am on the day of the absence.

It is the parents' / caregiver's responsibility to communicate this absence by either, emailing admin@zayedcollege.school.nz; calling the school (09 255 0904) or using the Skool Loop App to notify the college every day a student is absent.

If a student is absent for three days or more, the school requests a medical certificate. This is also a life lesson that students will need to learn as it is also required in the workforce.

If there is a justified reason for absence (e.g. due to illness, a funeral or tangihanga, or other approved reason at the discretion of the school), the principal may allow a student to be absent from school for up to five days only (Education and Training Act 2020, s 45). In the case of planned absences, requests must be made to the principal at least one week before the planned event. The principal has discretion to approve or deny requests.

### EARLY PICK-UP FROM SCHOOL

It has been observed that some parents are picking-up their child/children early and some on a regular basis.

Appointments must be made outside school hours. If this is unavoidable, please present the appointment card/ letter to the office **BEFORE** the appointment date.

There should be a genuine/good reason to pick-up your child/children during the day as they miss out on important learning.

Parents/caregivers are advised NOT to pick-up their child/ children during the above times.

All communication to parents about going home should come from the office. If your daughter is feeling unwell in the classroom, she must come to sickbay and Reception will call home.




